3. Saving eBook Pages for printing or emailing

Up to 100 pages of an eBook can be saved for printing or emailing per user as a PDF file.
Note: the number of pages may vary depending on individual publisher-specified limits.

To save eBooks pages as a PDF:

- Open the eBook.
- Go to the first page of the section of pages you would like to print and click the **Save Pages** icon in the tools menu.
- The **Save pages to PDF** menu is displayed.
- Select to include in the PDF:
 - **Current Page:** Save only the page you are viewing.
 - **Current Page and the next XX pages:** Enter the number of pages (up to 100) in the field provided.
 - **This Section:** Select to save the entire section of the eBook (if available to select)
- Select:
 - **Save PDF:** To save the selected pages and print them.
 - or **Send as E-mail:** To e-mail the selected pages as a PDF file to yourself.

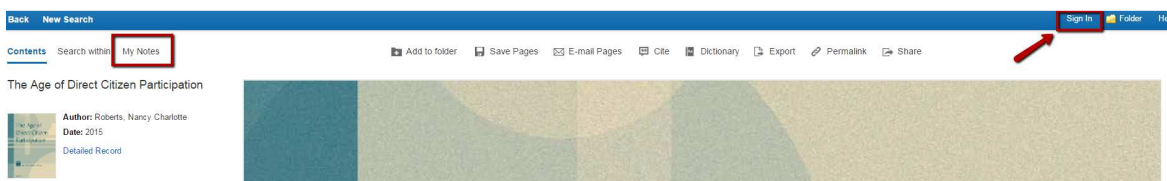
Note: eBook pages saved as a PDF can be transferred to, and read on eReader devices such as the Nook or Kindle. Consult your device's user manual for instructions on how to manually transfer files to the device.

4. Creating a note on eBooks

Available for PDF Full Text only, not available for EPUB Full Text.

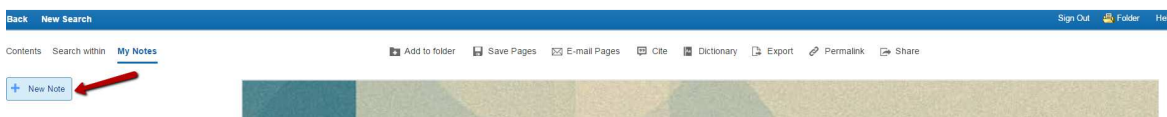
You can take notes on eBooks and save them to your **Folder** for later viewing. You need to **create a personal EBSCOhost account** before creating notes, so that you can save them into it:

- Click on **Sign In** (on the top right corner of the page)
- Click then on **Create a new account**
- Once your account is valid, you can start searching via the EBSCO platform for eBooks



How to create a note (for PDF Full Text only)

- Click **My Notes** (on the top left corner of the page)
- Click the **+ New Note** button that appears in the Notes area. If there are existing notes, they appear in a list in the Notes area.



Note: Click the **Sign in to store notes** link to save your notes to your personal account.

- Enter your note text in the field provided and click the **Save** button. You can adjust how the text appears in your note using the Bold, Italics, and Underline buttons above the text field.
